WHAT IS TRANSITION YEAR?

"Transition Year is a one year school based programme between Junior and Senior Cycle. It is designed to act as a bridge between the two by facilitating the smooth transition from the more **dependant learning** of the Junior Cycle to the more **independent self-directed learning** required for the Senior Cycle"

WHY DO TRANSITION YEAR?

- > Provides students with the opportunity to develop their individual gifts and strengths.
- Promotes the **holistic development** of our students by building confidence, self-esteem, independence and maturity. It encourages both personal and social development.
- They experience a year where the emphasis is on **individual responsibility** for study and self directed work. They develop as an independent and self motivated learner.
- > Provides a year free of exam pressure where the TY programme is learning led rather than exam led.
- > They prepare for the adult world through work experience (If possible) and workplace certification.
- Participate in a variety of subjects, workshops & activities. It gives the student the opportunity to do most of the subjects available for the Leaving Certificate, thus helping them to make an informed choice.

the environment and would like to continue their contribution to saving it one straw at a time into their future.


Making people more environmentally aware is very important to the girls so following their appearance on radio the four also featured on live television on Wednesday 15 January on RTE²⁹.






